Its purpose is to enable child and adult psychotherapists and counsellors to learn about each other's work and to deepen their thinking about clinical practice and related theoretical issues.

Mrs Isca Salzberger-Wittenberg is Honorary Consultant Psychotherapist and teacher at the Tavistock Clinic, London.

The event is open to adult psychoanalytic psychotherapists, child and adolescent psychotherapists, adult and child trainee psychotherapists, counsellors who are part of the SIHR Counselling Service and counsellors with five years of counselling practice and who are members of SIHR.

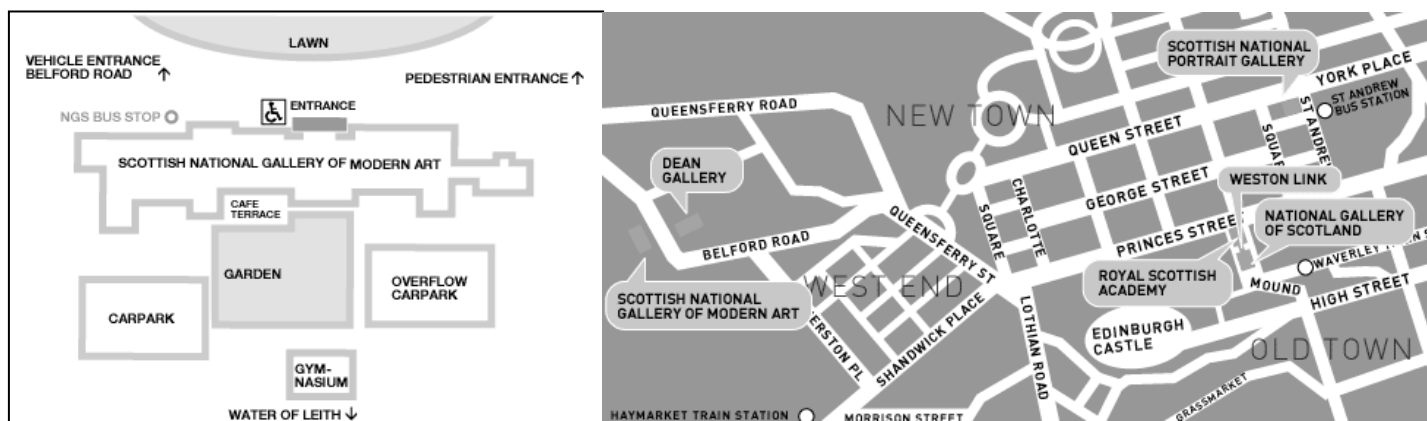
