## **Deprivation X 3: the contribution of organisational dynamics to the triple deprivation of looked after children**

**Louise Emanuel**

This presentation describes how the trauma and disturbance associated with severe deprivation and abuse within children and families, can impact on the professionals involved in their care, interfering with their capacity to think about and provide containment for the children and their carers, and thereby compounding their deprivation. Louise Emanuel will explore how this replication of the disturbance within the professional organisation can result in a further level of deprivation for these already damaged children.

**Louise Emanuel** is a Consultant Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist in the Child and Family Department at the Tavistock Clinic, London, where she runs the Under Fives Service and is Course Organiser for the PgDip/MA in Infant Mental Health and Early Years Development. She also undertakes clinical work with looked after children and is involved in the training and supervision of child psychotherapists at the Tavistock.

Louise has published the book: 'Understanding your Three Year old' (part of the Tavistock Clinic series), and a co-edited book on work

with Under Fives is due for publication in February 2008. She lectures both in this country and abroad, including Italy, Ireland, Holland and South Africa, where she is involved in a charitable community project relating to AIDS orphans and child headed households.

She has a special interest in consultation to organisations.
